



# SAT SCHOOL DAY: March 18, 2026

## FAQ

On Wednesday March 18th BHUSD will provide the College Board SAT School Day to **all Juniors**. Please see the FAQ below and feel confident as you walk into testing day!

### **Is this an official SAT?**

Yes. The results of this exam can be sent to colleges for consideration in an admissions decision.

### **What format is the test, and can this be taken remotely?**

This is now computer-based, students access the test in the Bluebook app. This is only administered in-person on campus.

### **Do I need to practice using Bluebook before test day?**

Students are encouraged to get familiar with the new digital format and practice using the available testing tools. Watch the [Get Ready for the Digital SAT School Day](#) video [here](#).

### **How do I access Bluebook?**

The Bluebook app has already been installed on your district issued device, the icon is on your desktop.

### **Do I need to sign up for the test on the College Board website?**

No. The district has registered all students.

### **Do I need to let my teachers know I will be missing classes?**

No. Teachers will be proctoring the exam, there are no classes that day.

### **What room number do I go to?**

Room Assignments will be posted by the library and the STC courtyard on Monday March 16th.

### **What time do I need to be there?**

Arrive on campus by **8:15 am** and make your way to your assigned room. *Doors close and the SAT begins at 8:30 am. No late students will be admitted once testing has begun.*

### **How long is the test?**

Standard testing time is estimated to be finished by 11:45 am, barring any unforeseen circumstances. Extended testing time varies.

### **If I am absent that day can I make up the test on another date?**

No. There is no make-up day. Junior students are expected to attend.

### **What do I need to bring on test day?**

- Your fully charged district issued device and charger
- Pencil or pen (for use with the school provided scratch paper)
- Your school ID
- Calculator, if you prefer over the embedded desmos calculator in Bluebook (see approved calculators [here](#))
- Water and snacks to consume during breaks

**What not to bring:**

**What does the SAT exam consist of?**

Evidence Based Reading and Writing and Math, each section is out of 800 for a total max score of 1600.

**When will I get my test results back?**

Most scores will be available starting on April 16, 2026. Students can view scores by creating a [College Board student account](#). If you provide your mobile number on test day you can also access your scores through the BigFuture® School mobile app.

**Will my SAT School Day scores automatically be sent to colleges?**

On test day, you have the option to choose up to 4 colleges you want your scores automatically sent for free. \*You are NOT required to choose this option on test day and can wait until you see your scores, however, you will have to pay for those scores to be sent.

Students that do not want their scores reported may request a cancellation by emailing Ms. Lederman ([mlederman@bhusd.org](mailto:mlederman@bhusd.org)). Cancellation requests must be submitted within 5 days of the test day.

There are only a small handful of highly selective colleges that will require students to report all testing. A majority of colleges will allow students to choose which scores to submit for an admission decision. For more information and resources visit [BHHS College Center - College Admission Tests](#).

**Can I still take the SAT again?**

Yes. Students can take the SAT and/or ACT multiple times. Colleges will accept both the SAT and ACT equally. Typically, students will take an admission exam 2-3 times and have the ability to choose which scores to send to colleges.

**What is the purpose of providing the SAT?**

The district is providing access for students in preparation for their post-secondary plans. In addition, the PSAT and SAT results provide larger data to help drive curriculum and placement throughout our high school.
