A description of how the funds will be used to increase or improve services for foster youth, low-income students, and English learners to improve A-G eligibility

BHUSD will use the funds to implement a Learning Lab course. This course will help identified students with organizational skills, provide credit recovery leveraging APEX Learning, and provide mentoring/ monitoring of students' grades. Students will be identified and recommended for the course.

A description of the extent to which all students, including foster youth, low-income students, and English learners, will have access to A-G courses approved by the University of California.

In BHUSD our graduation requirements are the same as A-G requirements. Also we have an open access policy for all students to have access to A-G courses that are approved by the University of California. Here is the link to our graduation requirements and open access policy:

The number of students who were identified for opportunities to retake A-G approved courses in which they received a “D”, “F”, or “Fail” grade in the 2020 spring semester or the 2020-21 school year and a description of the method used to offer the opportunity retake courses.

Number of Students: 489

Students are recommended for either summer school through our Educational Foundation or online free accredited educational provider. Students are also counseled into retaking the full course during the next school year by replacing an elective course with the failed course if it fits in their schedule. In addition students are offered the Learning Lab course at Beverly Hills High School. This course will help identified students with organizational skills, provide credit recovery leveraging APEX Learning, and provide mentoring/ monitoring of students' grades. Students will be identified and recommended for the course. Basically students have three options, they can take summer school, take the full course over, or enroll in the Learning Lab to assist with credit recovery and organizational skills.

A description of how the plan and described services, and associated expenditures, if applicable, supplement services in the Local Control and Accountability Plan and Learning Recovery Plan.

In BHUSD, we have identified this intervention to support our 9th -12th grade students in completing BHUSD graduation requirements and meet the A-G course requirements for the University of California through focus groups, teacher feedback and school counselors support.
