



BHHS PTSA General Meeting Minutes November 24th, 2025 9:00am in EDC

In Attendance - Please see attached sign in sheets. Quorum was met.

Welcome - The meeting was called to order by PTSA President Jenn Pedersen at 9:23am.

Pledge of Allegiance - Mrs Marcus led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of the Minutes - Minutes from the October 24th General PTSA meeting were presented for approval. Farrah Dodes moved to approve the minutes and Tina Richner seconded the motion. Minutes were approved as presented.

Financial Report - Farrah Dodes presented the financial report and checks to be ratified for October. The starting balance in October was \$200,880.68 The ending balance was \$202,881.60 The report will be filed for financial review. Tina Richner moved to ratify the checks written numbered 3518-3520, for the total amount of \$3,273.00 Hilla Carrel seconded, and motion passed.

Financial Review Report - Gil Bar Zion presented the PTSA financial review for January - June 2025. The accounts reviewed were the City National Bank account, the Preferred Bank checking account, the Preferred Bank money market account, and the Olshansky CD account. Gil stated for each of the accounts that he, along with Melissa Stein, CPA, have examined the records of the treasurer of BHHS PTSA and find them correct with no recommendations. Tina Richner moved to approve the Financial review report. Harim Lee seconded, and the motion was approved.

Special Presentation - Visual and Performing Arts - Dana Findley, VAPA coordinator discussed the recent and upcoming VAPA performances, including the Little Women play, Albion Street on 12/5, the instrumental musical and vocal musical Holiday Spectacular on 12/12, the incoming 9th grade students to BHHS during the day, and parents at night. The spring musical Six will be holding auditions after Thanksgiving, the art show will be in April, with the reception on 4/15.

Student Representative Report - Janice Moon and Zev Silver discussed that the activities for the semester were almost over. Upcoming is the Holiday movie on 12/18 on the field. Home Alone 2 will be on bean bags. Cost is \$5 or free with a GO card. In the spring, senior events will begin.

Teacher Representative Report - Sue Yovetich thanked PTSA for the Thanksgiving Staff luncheon. There are 3 weeks left in the semester. The exam schedule is out. Last week department coordination with BVMS happened. Lunch connections and fundraising are ongoing. College applications are underway with teacher letters of recommendation. Sign ups are open for the Science Fair. The tardy policy and the cell phone policy are working.

President's Report - Jenn Pedersen discussed last month's activities including PSAT day which included college & career prep for 10th and 12th graders. The October PTSA meeting highlighted Counselors and Athletics. PTSA supported the Dia de los Muertos display including the ofrenda, a mariachi band and snacks. PTSA can support other cultural experiences. For Halloween, Gaby Alexander on behalf of PTSA gave out staff treats. There was a wonderful student spotlight

luncheon. The ribbon cutting for the Salter Theater was on the opening performance of Little Women. For student recognition for attendance, PTSA gave out 740 cookies. PTSA hosted staff Thanksgiving luncheon catered by Factors. Parents donated desserts. PRIME students set the tables and did the floral arrangements. Upcoming events include the PTA Holiday Cookie Exchange on 12/17.

Principal's Report - Principal Loan Sriuksa discussed the PRIME program, which is High School for ages 14-18 with Ms Kathy, and Transition for ages 18-22 with Mr Woods. The PRIME program is essentially special ed with support and life skills. The PRIME Transition students do PRIME coffee, and the laundering of table cloths for the school and for PTSA. The PRIME High School students do PRIME floral which can be special occasion bouquets or vase arrangements, or subscription. The proceeds go back into the program. PRIME students also deliver birthday cards and treats to students, which makes everyone happy. We are closing down the semester with a push to finals. January starts senior activities and planning for next year. On Jan 20 all incoming 9th grade students will come to BHHS during the day, and their parents will come that night. Registration for 9th-11th graders will be happening soon. The guest speaker today will be recorded and shared after Thanksgiving. New computers for 9th graders will be distributed after winter break.

PTA Council Rep Report - Tina Richner gave an overview of what happened at the PTA Council meeting on 11/20. The Madrigals can be hired for caroling. Hawthorne school site is open for bike riding on the weekends. There is a City Greens program at each school site. From BHPD, Officers Rudy and Maitland discussed a possible DARE like program. They are hoping to get a work space and dedicated SRO at each school site. Ms Ida from BHPL discussed digital resources from the library, holiday shows, study space for finals, and park passes. The Teen Advisory Committee is holding a blanket drive. Stacey Book from Not Today Cancer spoke about the money raised from the 5K, a new sweatshirt for sale, and the upcoming toy drive for CHLA. The Compton PTA Toy drive will be 12/4-12/18 and also online. Parent education is trying to improve mental health throughout BHUSD.

Adjournment - Jenn Pedersen adjourned the meeting at 10:16am.
